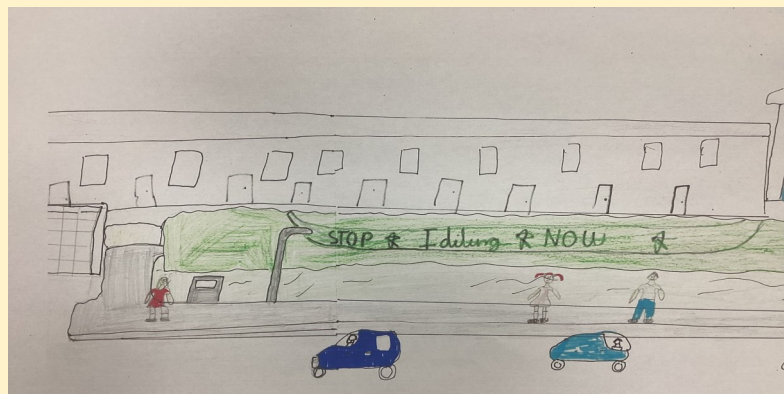
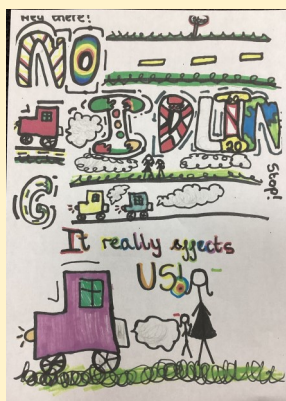

On one of my classroom visits, the children explained all the facts they had found out and how their information was going to support them in their project where they design a model lighthouse. There was significant excitement in both classrooms. Likewise, pupils in Nursery showed similar investigation skills last week as they 'exploded' a volcano in the classroom. They were thrilled to see the reactions taking place on their volcanic 'island'. The dinosaurs who were also surrounding the eruption seemed to be equally interested in the event! It was a delight to see.

All children demonstrating excellent attendance will be entered into the end of term award.



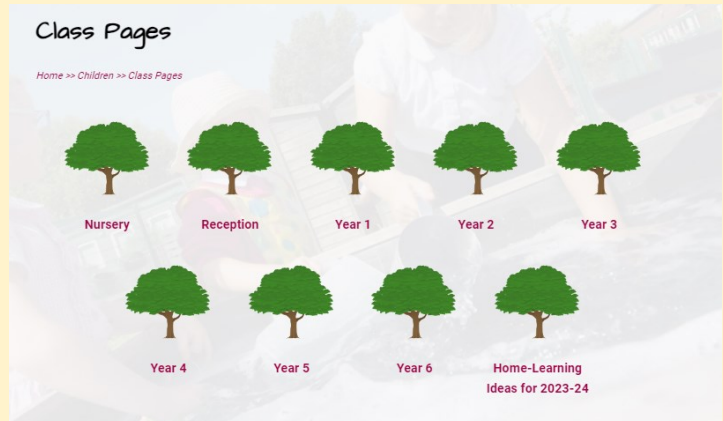
Grand Prize!

For each week of consistent attendance, pupils will be entered into a Grand Prize Draw. At the end of term, we will award a prize of a £50.00 cinema voucher.














What is my child learning this term?

with Miss Brown to review the books and are currently in the middle of reading 'Octopus.' They have shared some of their views thus far:

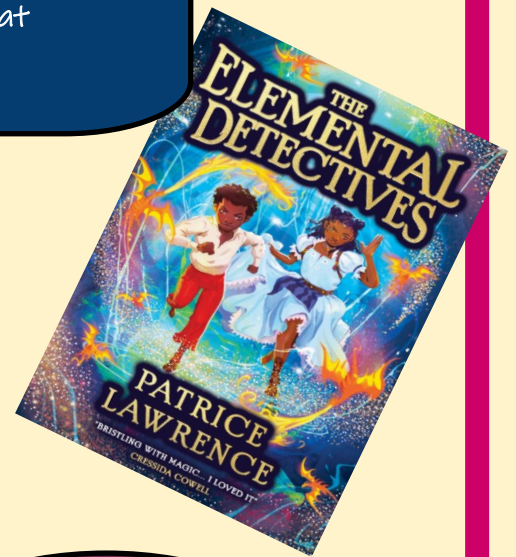


Nashwa...

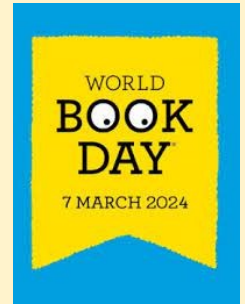


Lily...

The bigger aeroplanes went the furthest because there is more air resistance to push it up than there is gravity to push it down.

In Year 6, the children have been learning about forces. The children completed an experiment with paper aeroplanes to see how the different forces and size of the aeroplane affect their flight. They have made some wonderful observations about air resistance and the impact of gravity too.

Tuesday 27th February 2024

I predict that the bigger aeroplanes will fly the furthest because they are biggest and will have more air resistance to go the furthest.

When we took them outside the bigger aeroplanes went the furthest because they have bigger wings to have more air resistance.

Year 5

Pupils in Year 5 have produced some fantastic fairy tales and also used their writing skills across the curriculum when writing about the Mayan civilization. The children have reviewed and edited their work carefully. We are extremely proud of them.

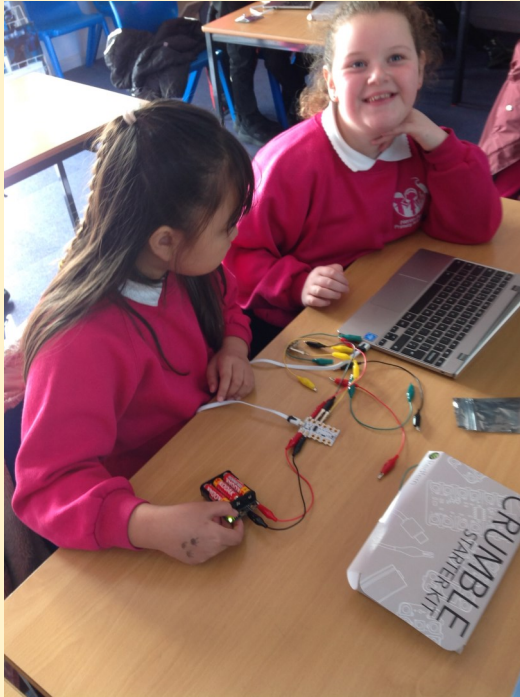

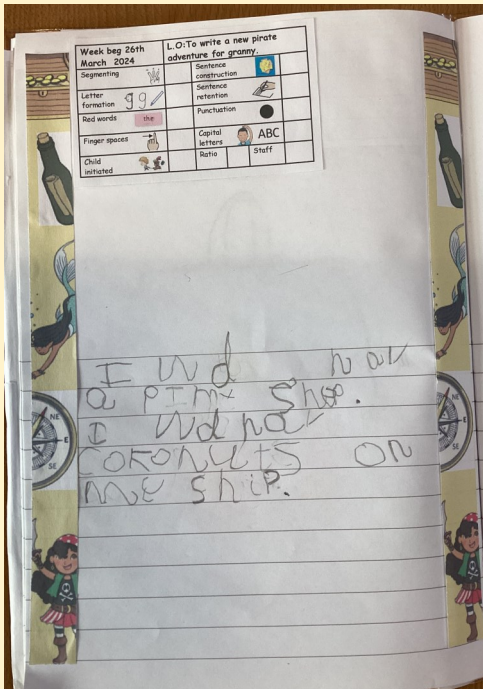


Year 1

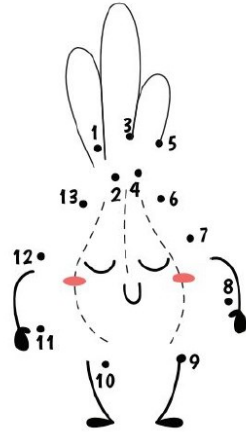
